SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY 2011-12 FACTS





FOUNDED Officially chartered in 1870 as a private, coeducational institution offering programs in the physical sciences and modern languages.

CHANCELLOR Nancy Cantor, 11th Chancellor and President.

MAIN CAMPUS Syracuse, located in the heart of Central New York, is within easy driving distance of Toronto, Boston, Montreal, and New York City.

EXTENDED CAMPUS SU offers a rich mix of academic programs, alumni activities, and immersion opportunities in numerous centers in the U.S. and around the globe, including major hubs in New York City, Washington, D.C., and Los Angeles.

ENROLLMENT The total University enrollment for fall 2011 is 20,829. Full-time undergraduate enrollment, 13,987; part-time undergraduate enrollment, 684; full-time graduate and law school enrollment, 4,465; part-time graduate and law school enrollment, 1,693.

STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS The total student population at Syracuse University represents all 50 U.S. states and 128 countries. The full-time undergraduate student population consists of 56 percent women and 44 percent men.

FIRST-YEAR STUDENT PROFILE The freshman class of 3,410 students has a mean high school GPA of 3.6; consists of 32 percent students of color; and 15 percent first-generation students. The entering student population consists of 56 percent women and 44 percent men.

DIVERSITY Minority students represent 24.4 percent of the total student population of 20,829. This includes 7.4 percent African Americans; 7.4 percent Asian Americans; 7.4 percent Hispanics; 0.6 percent Native Americans; and 1.6 percent of two or more races.

FINANCIAL AID Last year, nearly two-thirds of SU students received more than \$193 million in Syracuse University grants and scholarships. Overall, about 80 percent receive some form of financial support, including assistance from institutional, federal, state, or private sources.

FACULTY Full-time instructional faculty, 979; part-time faculty, 92; adjunct faculty, 475. Approximately 87 percent of full-time faculty members have earned Ph.D. or professional degrees.

2010-11 GRADUATES Bachelors, 3,122; Masters, 1,666; Juris Doctors, 191; Doctoral, 154.

CURRENT ALUMNI ON RECORD 240,983 alumni representing all 50 states and 163 countries and territories.

STAFF Full-time staff, 3,326; part-time staff, 376.

LIBRARY HOLDINGS Printed volumes, 3.4 million; microforms, 6 million; current periodicals/serials, 51,890; electronic books, 423,598.

TUITION Full-time undergraduate tuition: \$36,300 per year plus housing, meals, and expenses.

SPONSORED PROGRAMS A total of \$83.2 million was awarded for research, teaching, and other sponsored programs in fiscal year 2011. The federal government is the major sponsor (\$49.41 million). The largest non-federal sponsors are from various foundation sources (\$19.49 million). New York State is the third largest sponsor (\$6.04 million).

ENDOWMENT FUND The market value was approximately \$877 million as of 11.02.11.

THE CAMPAIGN FOR SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY Gifts and pledges from individuals, corporations, and foundations totaled more than \$940 million as of 12.31.11.
