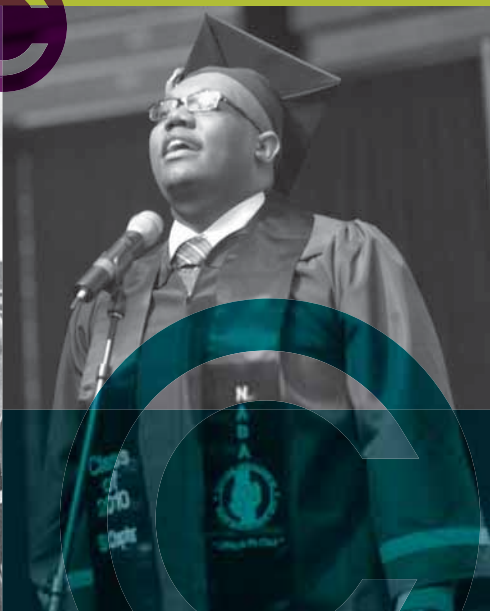

## Registration and Hospitality Goldstein Alumni & Faculty Center

### 401 University Place

Make this your headquarters for the weekend!

Pick up your Orange Central name badge and alumni button, as well as any last minute schedule changes at the Registration and Hospitality Center. Both the name badge and alumni button entitle you to 10 percent discounts at the SU Bookstore and the Schine Dining Center, as well as complimentary access to the recreational facilities at Archbold Gymnasium and Tennity Ice Skating Pavilion. So be sure to stop by for your SU I.D. for the weekend.

## Parking and Shuttle Service

If you arrive on Thursday afternoon or Friday during the day, complimentary parking is available in Booth Garage at the corner of Comstock and Waverly avenues. Beginning three hours before kickoff on Friday, there will be a fee to park in the garage. Please note that Booth Garage closes at 10 p.m. on Thursday, and 2 ½ hours after the game on Friday. If you arrive Saturday morning, complimentary parking is available in Booth Garage, Waverly Lot—at the corner of Waverly and South Crouse avenues—and Ostrom Lot—at the corner of Ostrom Avenue and University Place. **MAKE SURE TO DISPLAY YOUR ORANGE CENTRAL PARKING PASS ON YOUR DASHBOARD ALL WEEKEND, INCLUDING GAME DAYS.**

**Special note: Parking is restricted in campus permit lots on game days.**

Free parking and shuttle service will be available for both football and basketball. Football parking and shuttle will be at Skytop beginning three hours before kickoff. Basketball parking and shuttle will be at Manley beginning 1 ½ hours before tip-off. Shuttle drop-off is on College Place and pick-up will be on College Place or at the Goldstein Alumni & Faculty Center.

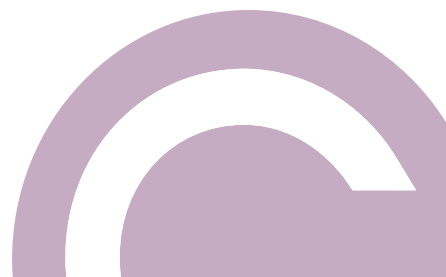
Disabled parking and shuttles for both games are available at Skytop beginning at the aforementioned times. The disabled shuttle will drop off at Gate A at the Carrier Dome, and will pick up at the same location following the games.

Shuttle service will also be provided to and from area hotels and campus. Main shuttle stops are at Goldstein Alumni & Faculty Center, Booth Garage, Sheraton Syracuse University Hotel & Conference Center, and the Crowne Plaza. If you're staying near Carrier Circle, shuttles will be stopping at the Embassy Suites and Courtyard by Marriott at the top of each hour to take alumni to campus. ## Connective Corridor

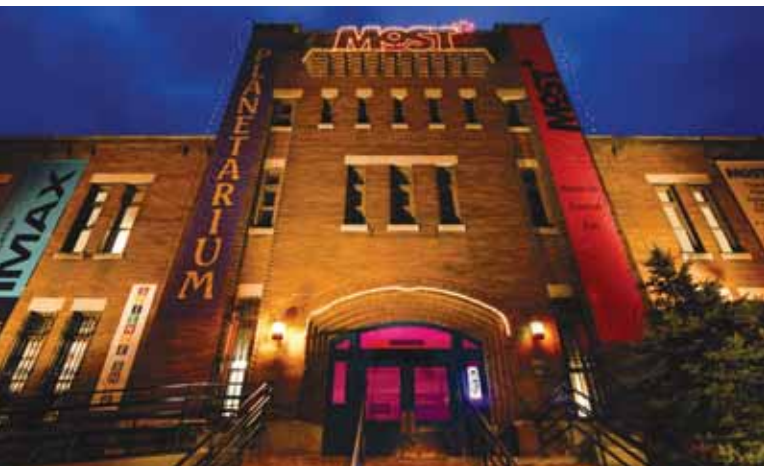
