For a privately sponsored applicant, acceptable evidence of funding consists of a certified current bank statement on official bank letterhead signed by an authorized bank official, indicating that sufficient funds exist to meet at least first-year expenses projected at \$57,549 for 2011-2012. A statement of earnings or income does not constitute acceptable proof of sufficient funding. A **government-sponsored applicant** must submit an original award letter (or a certified copy of an award letter). The letter must state the annual amount of the award in U.S. dollars. All financial documents must be written in English or translated in English and valid within one year of the start of the semester. When sending documentation of adequate funding, photocopies of financial documents are acceptable, and **you may fax them to 011-315-443-8427.** Please include a copy of your passport with the financial documents you send us. Be sure to write your name, date of birth, and name of the program to which you are applying on all documents you send.

Expenses for the first year include tuition, mandatory fees, other expenses, and living expenses.
